Icebreaker: A Different Flower

Draw a large daisy-shaped flower with an over-sized center. Think about non-physical things to describe people in your group. In the center, put words that describe everyone in the group. On the petals, put words that describe unique things about some group members.

Questions for Study or Discussion

- According to 1Samuel 16:7 and Acts 17:26 how does God view the biological races?
- There are two spiritual races: the redeemed and the unredeemed (1Pet 2:9). All humans share a spiritual origin (1Cor 15:22). What does it take to become part of the redeemed race (Rom 5:18)?
- According to Matthew 23:32-33 and Luke 3:17, how does God view the spiritual races?
- What role does ethnicity play in your standing with God (Gal 3:28, Col 3:8-11, Rom 10:12-13)?
- What is God's plan for the people groups within the redeemed race (Rev 5:9)?

Dig a Little Deeper: Bad News, Good News

Bad News	Good News
We are all sinners (Rom 3:23). We tend to put our own standard of right and wrong above God's standard. Racism is a form of pride that exalts people of one racial category over another. Racism is a sin.	The good news is that the power of the cross took away the power of sin to enslave redeemed people. Christ-followers can move from racism to love and compassion (Php 2:3-4).

2-Role of the Bible

Icebreaker: Bible Finds You

Questions for Study or Discussion

- God has spoken to us in His Word. It is His letter to us. How can a
 person say that they love God but throw His "letter" aside in favor of
 things that don't matter (Luke 10:25-28)? Make a list of activities
 that are less important than God.
- The purpose of Scripture is to help you believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. Once you believe, Scripture helps you have life in His name (John 20:31). What have you done to deepen your understanding of God's Word (2Tim 2:15)?
- The Bible is living and powerful. It can force us to face what is happening in our minds and hearts (Heb 4:12-13 and 2Tim 3:14-17). What are some times in your life when God's Word has confronted you?
- What does it take to become more Christ-like (2Cor 3:18)?

Dig a Little Deeper: Teaching, Reproof, Correction, Training

All Scripture is useful for teaching, reproof, correction, and training in righteousness (2Tim 3:16). Consider the First Commandment: "You shall have no other gods before me." (Exo 20:3). Scripture:

- **teaches** us truth. There is only one true God who rules us as we glorify Him. Scripture teaches us truth by saying, "This is right."
- reproves us. When we are not putting God first by giving Him his due worship, His Word rebukes our sin by saying, "That is wrong."
- corrects us. It points us back to what is right. It corrects us by saying, "Repent and serve the one true God."
- trains us. It shows us how to live with God as our God. It trains us by saying, "This is how to please God by the way you live."

Application Exercise: Confess and Commit

If you find yourself not reading your Bible, confess that to God. Ask Him to help you replace the trivial things on your schedule with time in His Word. Make a commitment that you will cooperate with His Word. Let it teach, reprove, correct, and train you.

- How can you be sure your family hears God's Word (Deu 6:4)?
- How have you used the principle of repetition to plant a key teaching [Deu 6:7]?
- What can you use as physical reminders of God's Word (Deu 6:8-9)?

Dig a Little Deeper: Make a Decision

Pray about the decision.	1The 5:16-18, Jas 1:5
Obey God's Word.	Deu 11:26-28, Psa 119:105
Apply biblical principles.	 When in doubt about appropriateness, don't do it [Rom 14:21-23]. Abstain from anything that appears evil (1The 5:22).
Seek godly counsel.	Pro 15:22, Pro 24:6
Delight in the Lord.	Psa 37:4-5, Psa 147:11
