- Do you ask Him to teach you His way?
- Do you tell Him you will listen and do what He says?
- Read [Psa 119:73](#).
- Do you pause and ask for His guidance during a storm?

Do you promise God you will praise Him with all your heart?

- Read [Psa 86:12](#).
- Do you desire to walk as God wants?
- Will you commit to praise Him with all your heart?
- Will you commit to glorify His name forever?
- Read [Psa 103:1-2](#).
- Do you remember all He has done for you?
- Do you remember how He has guided you through storms in the past?

Do you praise God for His mercy?

- Read [Psa 86:13](#).
- Do you ask God to unite your mind, heart, and soul to pursue Him?
- How often do you praise God for His mercy toward you?
- Do you realize that God doesn't punish His followers to the full extent of their sins, [Psa 103:10](#)?

Is it well with your soul?

- Horatio Spafford wrote the hymn “*It Is Well with My Soul*,” after the loss of his four daughters. God had taught him to say, “*It is well with my soul*” regardless of the storm.
- Do you know that your help only comes from the Lord, [Psa 25:5](#)?
 - Do you long to glorify His name?
 - Do you have peace in knowing, loving, and following Jesus Christ?
- Is it well with your soul?

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
